

Suggestions for Yellow Class (Reception)

- Please work on the targets you were given at parents' evening with your child.
- Read to your child and listen to them read to you. (Make sure they understand what they have read through questioning).
- Practise letter and number formation.
- Encourage children to write sentences independently. Correct use of capital letters, finger spaces and full stops. Encourage your child to read their sentences, to make sure it makes sense.
- Strengthen fine motor control using scissors, pegs and small objects for counting.
- Count reliably with numbers from 1 to 20.
- Place number(s) 1-20 in order.
- Say which number is one more/less than a given number to 20.
- Using quantities and objects, add two single-digit numbers and count on to find the answer.
- Using quantities and objects, subtract two single-digit numbers and count back to find the answer.
