Black History Month

Our theme for Black History Month this year is "Time for Change: Action Not Words."

We have been looking at people who are changing the world for the better, right now, and how they can inspire us to change the world as well.





Year 1 and Reception have been finding out about Missimi Issimi. When she was just 8 years old, Missimi started a campaign to clean up litter in Lagos, Nigeria, where she lives. She is 14 now and is an environmental campaigner. She has spoken at events all over the world about saving the environment, and has even set up a network of environment clubs, in schools in Nigeria. She encourages people to have hope that together we can make a difference to our environment.

Year 2 have been finding out about Baroness Floella Benjamin. She has done so many things to change the world. As well as being a brilliant actress, singer, presenter, director and writer, Floella has campaigned for children's rights, and to reduce child poverty. She has also campaigned for greater diversity in children's books and in the media. She was made a Baroness in 2010 for all her fantastic work.

Did you know that Floella was the person ever to appear on British TV when pregnant?

Year 6 have been finding out about Baroness Doreen Lawrence, the mother of Stephen Lawrence. In the years after Stephen's death, Baroness Lawrence has campaigned tirelessly to commemorate Stephen's life and to seek justice for his murder.

She has also set up a charity, the Stephen Lawrence Charitable Trust. The foundation works with young people from disadvantaged and underrepresented groups, to help them build their skills, gain qualifications and realise their full potential.

We have learnt that terrible events can inspire people to do remarkable things. But we have also learnt that we still have a long way to go to create a fair world for everybody.

Year 5 have been learning about Dr Maggie Aderin-Pocock.

She is a space scientist and science educator. As well as inventing part of a telescope which examines stars in far away galaxies, Dr Maggie campaigns to encourage young people, especially girls and people from underrepresented groups, to follow careers in science.



Year 4 have been finding out about Marcus Rashford. Of course Marcus is a professional footballer, who plays for Manchester united and England. But he is also a campaigner. He is probably best known for his campaign, during the COVID-19 lockdown, to provide free meals for children, and for his on-going fight to end food poverty across the country. But he also set up FareShare, an organisation which takes food that would otherwise have been wasted and distributes it to people around Manchester who need it. In 2019, he worked with Selfridges to provide food boxes for homeless people. And he has campaigned for a permanent increase in the amount of money people get through universal credit.

Year 5 and Year 6 Cross Country

Well done to all of our Year 5 and Year 6 cross country runners, who took part in the Croydon schools competition this week, they all did brilliantly. Well done to Elina, who was our highest placed runner. But a special mention has to go to Jediah, who lost one of his shoes right at the start of the race but carried on, wearing just one shoe, for the whole race. What incredible resilience. Jediah, we are so proud of you!


Reading Week at Monks Orchard
