


#### Year 1

Donaldson class have been practising number bonds to 10 this week. They worked in pairs, using cubes to find all the ways to make 10 (some even found ways to make 20). They wrote their answers on whiteboards. Already they're number bond experts!








#### Year 5

We investigated friction using oil and jelly cubes. Each group was given pieces of jelly and they had to transfer them from one plate to another, using pencils like chopsticks.

After we covered the jelly in oil, we had to repeat the experiment. This time it was a lot harder to move the cubes because of the oil and the lack of friction between the pencils and the jelly cubes. We used a timer and recorded our results.

We learnt that Friction is the force acting between two surfaces when they slide, or try to slide, across each other. The oil reduces friction and therefore it becomes harder to grip the jelly cubes.








#### Year 4

Year 4 have started a science investigation this week. We are investigating which drink causes the most tooth decay. We have left a hard boiled egg in different liquids and we will check in a week's time to see which liquid has caused the most damage to the shell of the egg.
