We are looking forward to going again next year!






Year 6 Digital Art

This week we had a go at recreating this image of a soldier, using a painting programme on the laptops.


We spent a lot of time looking at the techniques the artist used to convey emotion. It was really tricky but we persevered and have made a good start.
