
Year 1

Year 1 have started a new topic in Science 'Animals Including Humans'. This week they learnt about 'mammals'. They watched video clips, found out lots of information about mammals and listed lots of them!

In Geography, the children were able to use an atlas to identify the position and significance of the Equator, North and South hemisphere, and the Tropics of Cancer and Capricorn, on a world map. They were able to explore the many countries within each continent and discussed whether they were North of the equator, on the equator or South of the equator.



Year 6

Year 6 have been enjoying their World War Two topic. In their most recent lesson, they looked at the outbreak of war and The Munich Agreement. They started the session by comparing maps of Europe from 1917, 1919, 1938 and 1939.



Reception

We introduced estimating, which the children found a little challenging initially but with perseverance they were then able to estimate how many spoons of porridge would be needed to fill the various bowls. The children used the wooden bricks to build beds for the bears, carefully measuring to ensure the bears would fit. Finally lots of racing outside on the bikes and scooters recording who was first, second and third with the chalks.


