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

This week Reception have been celebrating the Lunar New Year. We created lucky red envelopes, made dancing dragons and bopped to the beat of the tambourine.


To extend our number knowledge the children had to select a number card with tweezers and then feed the hungry crocodile that amount of counters, being very careful not to overfeed him!


Contact Details
