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









### Year 5


#### Year 2




### Year 3

### **Holidays During Term Time**

You will have seen in the news this week that fines for nonattendance at school are due to increase in September; from £60 per child per parent, to £80 per child per parent. And these fines may be imposed after 5 days of absence.

We wanted to take this opportunity to clarify some points about holidays during term time.

<u>The school does not authorise holidays during term time.</u> This is a Trust-wide policy.


If you choose to take your child on holiday during term time the school will refer the absence to the local authority, who may choose to impose a fine.

Please do still let us know about holidays and provide as much information as you can. We submit any information you give us to the local authority, who may consider this when making their decision about a fine.

Parents/carers who provide no information or do not inform the school are far more likely to be fined.

Any fines are issued by the local authority. The school does not issue fines. The school is not part of the decision making process about fines. The school does not receive any money from fines that are issued.
