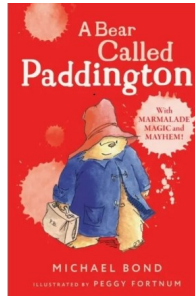
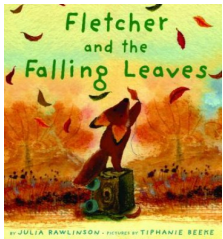
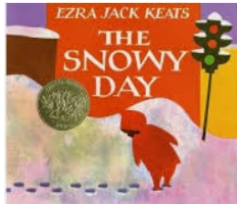

Mini Pitta Pizzas

What You'll Need:

- Mini pitta bread
 - Tomato sauce.
 - Shredded mozzarella cheese.
 - Toppings: Sliced vegetables (bell peppers, olives, mushrooms, cherry tomatoes), cooked chicken, pepperoni, or pineapple.
- A baking tray and parchment paper.

Instructions:

1. **Prepare the Base:** Lay out the pitta breads on a baking tray lined with parchment paper.
2. **Spread the Sauce:** Let your child spoon and spread tomato sauce evenly on each base.
3. **Add the Cheese:** Sprinkle a handful of shredded cheese on top.
4. **Top It Off:** Encourage your child to design their pizza using a variety of toppings.
