### Think Before You Share

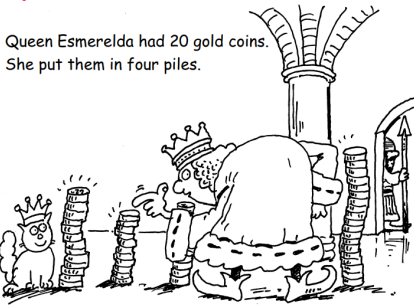
